

Williamson County Quarterly Court
January Term 1910

Be it resolved:

1. That this Court, representing all the people of Williamson County, do heartily endorse the movement to establish a National Park by the Federal Government at Franklin, to commemorate the heroism and valor of the soldiers of the armies who made themselves immortal in the Great battle fought there on November 30, 1864.
2. That the Congress of the United States is hereby respectfully memorialized and urged to establish a National Park on the Battle Field at Franklin, to be under the care, management and control of the government, as a memorial to the heroism and valor of the brave soldiers who were engaged, and especially these who yielded up their lives as an oblation to duty in that sanguinary conflict, whereby valor and devotion to country was exemplified and exalted to a degree worthy of the emulation of mankind and of posterity for all time to come.
3. That a copy of these resolutions be sent to the Senators from Tennessee and our Representative in Congress from this Congressional District, with a request that they present them to their respective Houses of the Congress.
